SPOTLIGHT: Julia Godzikovskaya, Senior Research Manager, Training and Research Division of Felton Institute

Julia Godzikovskaya, Senior Research
Manager for Felton's Training and
Research Division, grew up in a family
where education and hard work were
highly valued. Her mother was a musician
and her father was an engineer; both
were successful in their fields in Moscow,
Russia. Her grandparents had
experienced great hardships in their
youth, but what impressed young Julia
most was their spirit of optimism and
contentment, despite the suffering and
trauma that they had endured.

"My maternal grandmother was a survivor of the Siege of Leningrad during WWII, which led to extreme starvation and resulted in the deaths of more than a million people. I spent a lot of time with her while growing up, and she was the kindest, warmest and most genuine person I ever met. She taught me to treat others the way I want to be treated and to appreciate every day of life," Julia recalls

Reading was a favorite pastime of Julia's, and she and her classmates and friends spent many hours discussing what they read. Her first education was in Russian philology, and she thought her career might include being a literary critic and teacher.

When Julia moved to the United States, her first home was in Washington, D. C., and her second was in Los Angeles, California, before moving to San Francisco. She initially worked as a translator and graphic designer before deciding to attend graduate school at San Francisco State University, where she earned her MA in psychological research.

"When I decided to get a graduate degree, I wrote on my application that I wanted to feel that I was making a difference in people's lives and ultimately would like to work for

a non-profit organization that promotes social justice. Working for Felton Institute is consistent with this aspiration, and I hope to be able to contribute more to Felton's mission of responding to human needs with innovative social services," Julia shares.

Julia joined the Felton team in June 2014. Before that, she had a corporate high-tech job, but she really wanted to work with more diverse responsibilities that would help her feel more connected to people. Julia adds, "My work at Felton allows me to wear many different hats and interact with inspiring and knowledgeable people who dedicate their lives to helping others. My job forces me to adjust to other people's priorities, and this has been challenging, but at the same time, a rewarding experience. It also forces me to learn new things almost every day."

When Julia is not working, she enjoys traveling, volunteering, running, spending quality time with family and friends and her beloved hobby of reading.

Her personal motto is "everything is learnable, and it is never too late to learn", and her personal mission is to embody her beloved grandmother's values of treating people with kindness and to appreciate each day of life.

In June 1945, fifty-one nations gathered in the Veterans War Memorial building to debate the potential of the United Nations Organization in an effort to preserve world peace. The member nations discussed details over cocktails in the Green Room that would eventually lead to the signing and ratification of the United Nations charter in the Herbst Theater down the





hall. Today, 191 nations participate in what was once only a vision that 51 delegates pursued within this building.

As the sun began its descent for the evening, the night was just beginning for Felton within the Green Room. Holiday tunes filled the air; guests arrived in greater numbers and a delectable spread of appetizers, side dishes and entrees were presented for all to enjoy. Revelers filled the dance floor, challenging colleagues to top their moves.


Friday's celebration at 2730 Bryant Street will include performances, refreshments, and of course, an ugly holiday sweater contest!
