1998

Felton becomes the first nonprofit in San Francisco to extend its medical benefits to employees' same-sex partners.



1980

Felton's board president, Donovan Thompson sits as the first openly gay president of a nonprofit board in the country.



1973

Felton's medical director, Dr. Richard Shadoan advocates vigorously to declassify homosexuality as a "sexual deviation" in the DSM.



1962

Bernard Mayes, an openly gay Anglican priest, establishes the San Francisco Suicide Prevention crisis hotline.
