

Thank you for visiting Felton Institute. If you are here because you need housing support and want to connect to the Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool (FHSP) Program, please note that Felton Institute is not allowed to take direct referrals for the FHSP program. All referrals Felton Institute's FHSP program receives come from San Francisco's Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) department. We are not allowed any exceptions to HSH's policies regarding referrals. You will need a completed Coordinated Entry assessment, from an ACCESS POINT, to be referred to one of HSH's housing assistance programs (such as FHSP, Rapid Rehousing, etc.) Referrals will be determined by HSH, based on the outcome of the Coordinated Entry assessment.

Below, you will find resources that will help you get connected with housing support.

How to get assessed for a referral to a housing program:

- 1. Please visit an ACCESS POINT and complete a Coordinated Entry assessment.
- 2. Stay in contact with ACCESS POINT staff to get **updates** on the **status** of your housing referral.
- 3. Depending on the results of the coordinated entry assessment, HSH staff will refer you to a housing program or support service. You will be contacted by a representative of the referred program. Therefore, it is important to **keep your contact information updated** with the ACCESS POINT.

ACCESS POINTS

Access Points are in-person locations where a Coordinated Entry team connects you to services/resources, assesses your needs, and helps you figure out your options.
